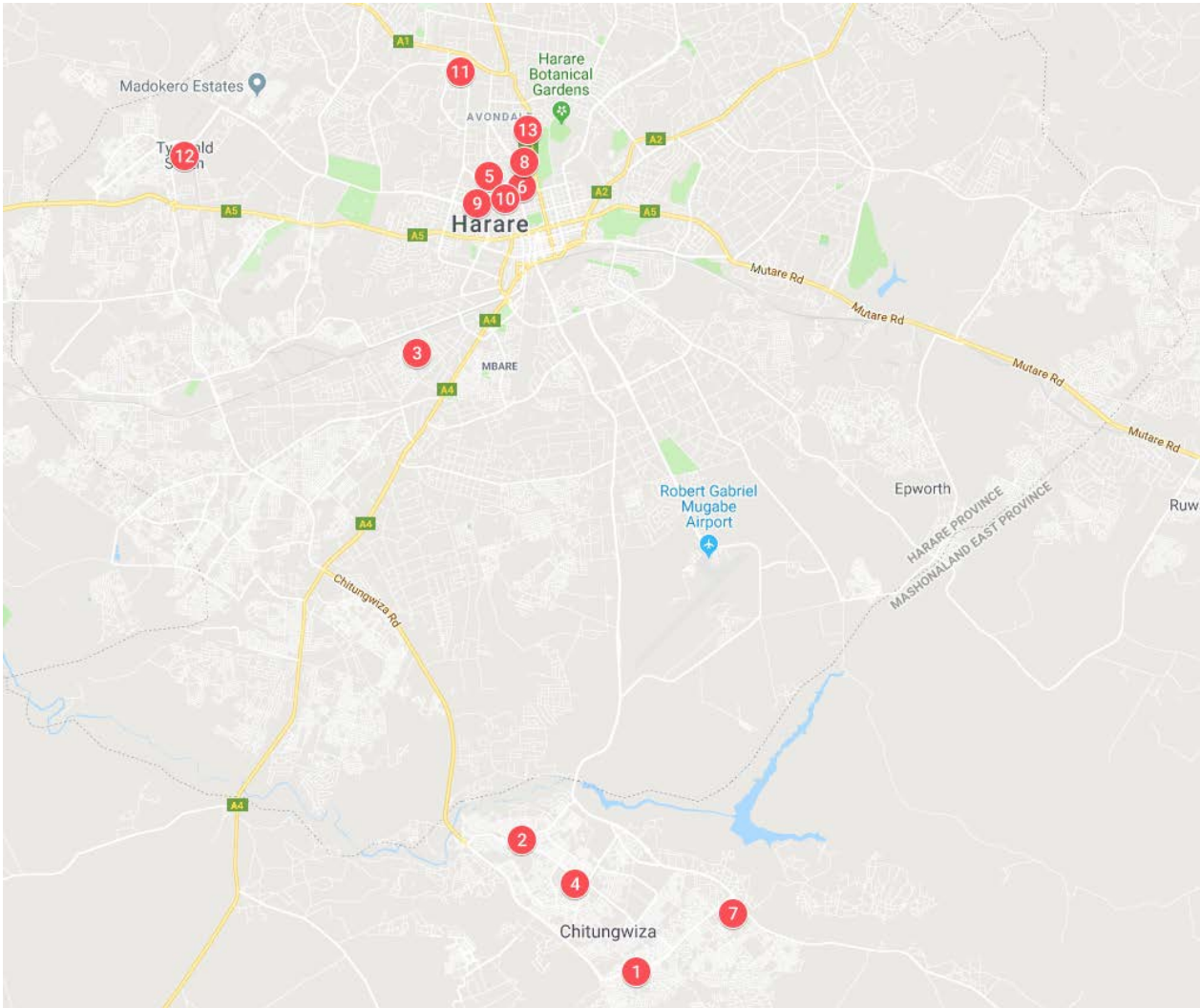

- Act as gate-keepers

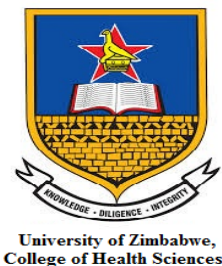
