















Why was the Trio study done?

- TRIO = Tablet, Ring, Injection as Options
- Women need choices that fit their lifestyles, otherwise even the most effective products will not protect women <u>if they are not used</u>.
- TRIO tested the products for dual role of HIV prevention and contraception.
- The products were all placebo; the study focused on how the women would prefer to take the products.





TRIO Study Goals








To find out which of three potential products – a monthly vaginal ring, monthly injections, or daily tablets – young women would prefer in preventing both HIV and pregnancy.

To learn what things young women like and dislike in these products, so that they can be improved.






Study Design






What did women think of the products? (Qn: Please rate how much you liked the product you used over the past month on a scale of 1-


