

Whose opinions matter?



Since HIV risk is so high for pregnant women, PrEP should just be rolled out for pregnant women <u>now</u>.

When considering approval of DELIVER and B-PROTECTED, community members' views are more important than ethicists and regulators

If regulators do not approve DELIVER & B-PROTECTED, we can just wait for other countries to do the research and accept their study results

It is too risky to conduct research in pregnant and breastfeeding women: let's just keep things as they are now.

Since we have ARV treatment for those who get infected with HIV and we have PMTCT to prevent HIV to babies – we don't have to worry if pregnant women get HIV

What about their rights?

Pregnant and lactating women should be able to reap the same benefits from the development of new therapies as other populations and have a right to the assurance that the therapies they are prescribed have been studied specifically to determine safety, efficacy, and appropriate dosing during pregnancy and the postpartum period.
